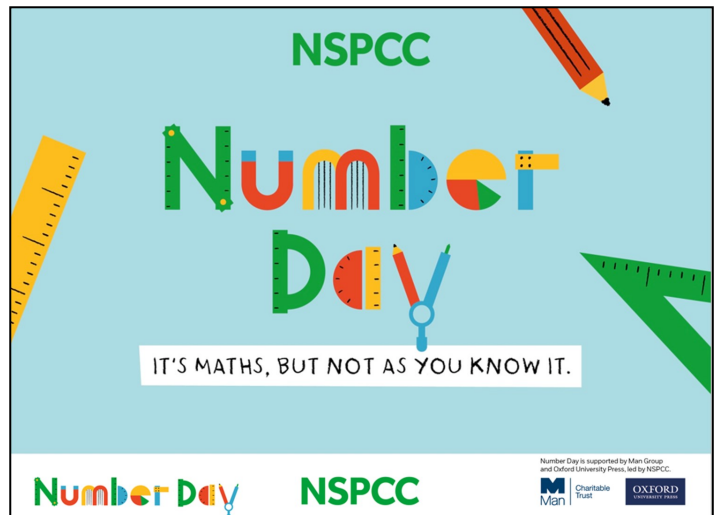




Non Uniform Day Friday 7th May
