## **PE and Sports Premium Grant**

Haughton School was allocated a grant of £8560 to support Primary P.E for the academic year of 2016-2017

### **DFE Outlined Purpose of Funding:**

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and Sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

### **Possible uses for the funding might include:**

Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs. Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and Sport. Providing cover to release Primary teachers for professional development in PE and Sport. Running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games. Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and Sport, providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

### **Haughton School Expenditure:**

Haughton School continues to invest a considerable budget to support PE and sports opportunities across the school in every key stage for all groups of pupils. The PE/Sports offer in the school includes access to:

#### **EYFS**

- Outdoor learning environment planned daily – Resources regularly updated
- Transport to The Bridge School to allow the pupils to access their specialist EYFS gym which includes sensory integration equipment. in the EYFS gym
- A wide range of equipment including bikes, balls, small equipment
- Body awareness and movement groups including parachute games during P.E Sessions
- Swimming on a weekly basis throughout the whole of the academic year

### **Key Stage 1**

- Resources for physical development during child initiated learning (Plan do Review)
- Physical activity during morning break and at lunchtime
- Access to Soft Play
- A wide range of equipment including balls, small equipment etc
- Body awareness and movement groups during PE sessions
- Weekly Swimming for 2 terms out of the academic year

### **Key Stage 2**

- Physical activity during morning break and at lunchtime
- Access to Soft Play
- Use of range of outside play equipment
- Specialist PE programme focusing on the development of Fundamental Skills
- Weekly Swimming for 2 terms out of the academic year

### **Whole School**

- Throughout the school, advice is integrated from other professionals as relevant to individual pupils e.g. Physio,OT,VI/HI teachers. Some individuals will have specific equipment such as walking aids and standing frames etc.
- After school clubs are also offered with different opportunities during the year.
- Staff training has been funded through the school training budget.
- The school commissioned 1 day a week of Sports Partnership Co-ordinator. The Co-ordinator arranged a wide range of additional sporting opportunities and access to outside coaches etc.
- Sports events are delivered directly to pupils including in after school clubs.
- Access to Cross Bar Football Coaching.
- Participation in inter school sporting events.

### **Allocation of the funding**

The grant for Primary Sports Partnership supported the wider budget that is committed to PE and was specifically spent on:

- £6,555 contribution towards £10,000 1 day / week Sports Co-ordinator Post, this position allowed for a qualified coach to lead all swimming sessions
- £1,995 Weekly Cross Bar Coaching Sessions (2 hours / week )

### **Outcomes from Expenditure**

- Swimming assessments indicate improved water confidence and skill for all children throughout the school
- Increased number of children by the end of year 6 being independent swimmers
- PE assessments evidence fundamental skill development of all children
- Increased pupil participation and enjoyment in a range of sporting activities.

The following sports events were organised to increase participation:

- Sports event to Southall Athletics KS2
- Santa Claus Circuits, Athletics KS1 & KS2
- Winter games 7th March Athletics KS2,
- School games @ Shrewsbury Sports Village-Athletics KS1 & 2
- Shropshire Cricket delivered 4weeks of coaching for Year 6 pupils
- Whole School Sports Day
- Year 6 Fishing
- Interschool Football matches – KS2

The impact of above is seen in:

- Wider participation in events
- Wider range of events being offered
- Interaction, participation and competitor across schools
- Higher quality provision evidenced in awards
- Excellent PE curriculum offer
- We have retained our Bronze Kite Mark.
