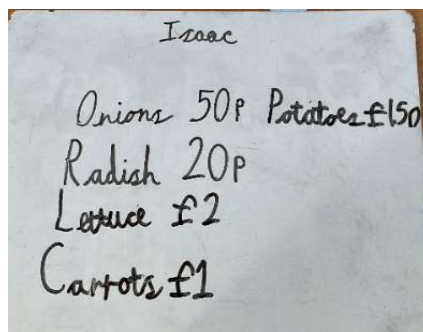
We have also explored which vegetables grow above the ground and which vegetables grow below the soil.

to use their knowledge of money and to use a budget of £5 to buy plants, bulbs or seeds and calculate the change needed, before planting them in the hub garden together.



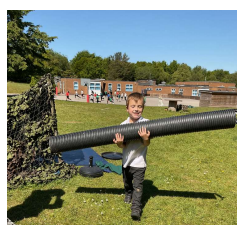

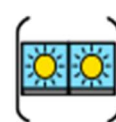
