They completed sentences using positional language such as up, down, left, right, backwards and forwards to describe the movement of objects on a grid.

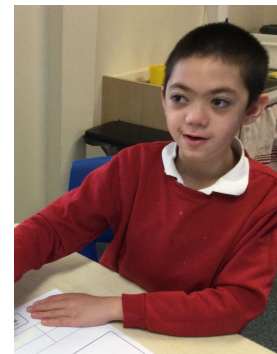
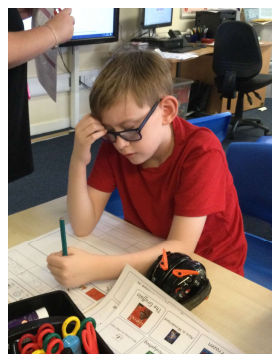
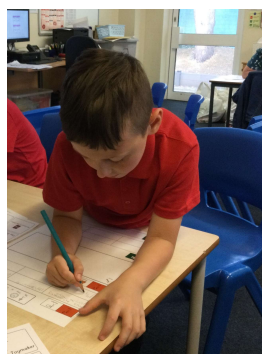


PSHE
