In topic, the year 1 children have continued their enjoyment of the 'Supertato' text as they designed and built their own Supertato.





We thought carefully about how our bodies might feel when feeling cross or angry and discussed what we could do to help us calm. We then used balloons to represent the feeling of anger and how to release this feeling as we begin to learn how to self-regulate. During play and

learn, Albie and George used the dressing -up box to represent and communicate their thinking.












