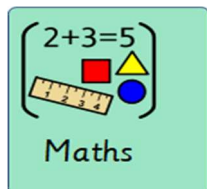




Welcome

This week, the children have continued to be amazing and have worked incredibly hard in all areas of their learning.



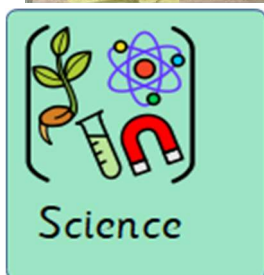
In maths, some children have been working systematically to find and recognise number bonds to 10. Together, we worked practically to help recall our number facts quickly. We also used the bar model to represent our thinking and sang the 'Ten, Ten Again' song to secure this knowledge. (see link below). In Science, the children have enjoyed exploring and describing how things move. They have explored forces through making ramps using planks, crates and blocks. The children worked collaboratively and scientifically to investigate the question- 'Which car travelled the furthest.' The children made simple predictions and wrote sentences to explain their findings.





In Geography, the children have continued to explore real life superheroes and think carefully about where they work and live. To extend this learning, the children explored their local environment and the buildings around them, using pictures and symbols to show familiar places and what they are used for. They discussed the features of different types of houses, a fire station, and a hospital before creating a 3D map.

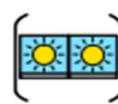
