As part of the Big School Birdwatch, the children made their own Cheerio bird feeders and then headed outside to complete a bird survey. Using tally charts, they spotted blackbirds, a pigeon, and several sparrows. The children loved being real-life nature detectives.

In our topic work, we have been finding out what plants need to survive. The children planted cress seeds and set up a simple investigation by watering some seeds and leaving others dry. Over the weeks, they have been observing and comparing the differenceslots of great scientific thinking happening.
